Q-Ships

Cobh is a town in Ireland, on Great Island in Cork harbour. Cobh is gaelic for Cove. In 1750, Smith the historian, when referring to Cove village, said: "it was inhabited by seamen and revenue officials".

In the 19th century, due to its naturally protected harbour setting, the town became an important tactical centre for naval military base purposes, particularly at the time of the Napoleonic Wars. This led to the town becoming a British naval port with its own admiral.

In 1849 the name of the town was changed to Queenstown, to honour Queen Victoria who had visited Ireland during that year.

Being one of the major transatlantic Irish ports, Queenstown was the departure point for 2.5 million of the six million Irish people who emigrated to North America between 1848 and 1950. It was also a major embarkation port for men, women and children who were deported to penal colonies such as Australia. In 1912 Queenstown was famously the final port of call for the RMS Titanic when she set out across the Atlantic on her ill-fated maiden voyage. In 1915 survivors and dead alike were brought to Queenstown when the RMS Lusitania was sunk by a German U-boat.

During the First World War Queenstown was a naval base for British and American destroyers operating against the U-boats that preyed upon Allied merchant shipping. Q-ships, heavily armed merchant ships with concealed weaponry, designed to lure submarines into making surface attacks, were called Q-ships precisely because many were fitted-out in Queenstown.

In 1920 the town changed its name to Cobh. Due to its tactical military importance the port remained a UK sovereign base until it was handed over to the government of the Irish Free State in 1938.

Cobh remained an important harbour and from 1960 to the mid 1980's Verolme operated a shipyard. The last ship built there by Verolme was the Irish Naval Service's LÉ Eithne (P31).

Bodies of WWII sailors dumped in mass grave

It has been claimed that the remains of WWII sailors who died on British and Dutch warships were secretly dumped in a mass grave near the port of Brondong, in East Java, by modern-day metal scavengers as they rifled through wrecks illegally lifted from the sea bed.

The wrecks are regarded as treasure troves by the salvagers and up to 40 WWII-era vessels have been removed from the waters off Indonesia and destroyed by operators seeing to cash in on the valuable metals on board. These include HMS Electra, HMS Exeter, and HMS Encounter.

A Ministry of Defence spokesman has said that 'The British Government condemns the unauthorised disturbance of any wreck containing human remains. Desecration of wrecks of war and merchant vessels is against International Law, which also provides protection for war graves. Under International Law naval warships and associated artefacts enjoy protection through Sovereign Immunity'.

Around 900 Dutch sailors died in the Battle of the Java sea on HNLMS De Ruyter, HNLMS Java, and HNLMS Kortenaer. They were sunk, along with UK, Australian and US vessels, in 1942, during one of the costliest sea battles for the allies, only to be the target of the illegal metal traders between 2014 and 2016. Dutch divers, planning to put plaques on the vessels, found they had vanished in 2016.

The Indonesian government has insisted it is not to blame as there was no formal request for them to be protected.

In January the National Museum of the Royal Navy and the Maritime Archaeology Sea Trust said they were linking up in an effort to deter those planning to rob sites in UK seas. They will use satellites, radar and sensors to monitor suspicious activity near wreck sites, the Royal Navy said.
