Are you in need of new hips and/or knees?

Did you know.....

As a veteran you can ask for a referral to a specialist Orthopaedic clinic at The Robert Jones & Edith Hunt Orthopaedic Hospital, Oswestry, Shropshire, SY10 7AG. This is a centre of orthopaedic excellence specialising in lower limb replacement surgery.

The service is open to those who have served with the UK military, including National Service, and treats arthritic lower limb problems, especially those requiring hip and knee replacements.

The service is led by Lt Col Carl Meyer, a consultant military orthopaedic surgeon with a special clinical interest in hip and knee replacements.

So, if you have a long wait ahead of you for a hip or knee replacement, why not ask your GP to refer you to Lt Col Carl Meyer at the Veterans' Hip & Knee Surgery Service, Oswestry. WWI Beacons of Light

11th November 2018



After the German Revolution, abdication of Kaiser Wilhelm II and the success of the Allied Hundred Days Offensive, the ability of Germany to continue waging war in terms of resources and will was at breaking point.

In the wake of the German sailor's mutiny at Keil at the end of October 1918, which quickly spread throughout Germany, a republic was declared on 9th November. The new civilian government accepted the terms for a ceasefire from the Allies.

The Armistice was signed on 11 November 1918 and came into effect at 1100, bringing about the cessation of hostilities in the First World War, but technically, not a German surrender.



In commemoration and remembrance of the end of the war and the many millions who were killed or came home dreadfully wounded, 1000 Beacons of Light will be lit at 1900 on 11 November 2018 throughout the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, Isle of Man and UK Overseas Territories - a century after the guns fell silent. The event will also commemorate the huge army of men and women on the home front who, often in dangerous and exhausting conditions, underpinned the war effort - keeping the wheels of industry turning, bringing the harvests home to ensure the nation did not starve.

The Beacons will symbolise the 'light of hope' that emerged from the darkness of war.

For the opportunity to take part in this event, check if a council, community, or organisation near you is involved.

HMS Queen Elizabeth

On 29 June the 65,000 ton HMS Queen Elizabeth headed out of Rosyth dockyard to sea trials through an exit with only 14 inch clearance on either side and 20 inches of water under the keel, then edged along the Forth, under three bridges, with a little over six feet to spare.



'Big Lizzie' towered above warships escorting her off the east coast of Scotland as she began sea trials. On 5 July a Merlin helicopter landed on her enormous flight deck - the first aircraft to touch down on Britain's biggest warship.

On Wednesday 16th August HMS Queen Elizabeth arrived in Portsmouth, where, at its narrowest point, there was less than 66ft (20m) clearance on each side.


